Economic Impact of Travel in California 2012-2021

In 2021, the California travel economy was still recovering after the fall from the peak year of 2019. Strong demand for overnight accommodations and increased commodity prices led to large gains in visitor spending.

Direct travel-related spending in California grew to \$100.2 billion in 2021 a 46.3 percent increase from the previous year. Compared to the peak of 2019, travel spending was down 30.9 percent in 2021. Visit California
